Saturday 25th May EMMONTAGNÉE AU MOUËT

Join them, leaving Linga at 8.30am, passing through the village at 9.30am (a complementary small glass of white wine is offered in front of the Tourist Office), enjoying a light snack at Barbossine at 11am, arriving in Mouët around 12noon/12.30pm in time for lunch (reservation required).

Saturday 1st June ECOLOVIE DAY

Friday 28th to Sunday 30th June PASS'PORTES DU SOLEIL MTB

This Franco-Swiss MTB event will welcome over 8,000 participants, departing from 8 different resorts, covering 80kms of Portes du Soleil tracks on a circuit punctuated by refreshment stops serving local produce and good-humoured encouragement!

There will also be Pass'Portes kids, Pedestrian Pass'Portes and E-Pass'Portes events. And the Gravel ride returns for the second consecutive year, also with locally-sourced refreshment stops along the route. The ride takes place over two days. 28th June between France and Switzerland and 29th June around Mont de Grange.

Châtel hosts the MTB show.

Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th July SAVOIE CHEESE FESTIVAL

The 19th Savoie Cheese Festival will take place in Châtel, the heart of the AOP Abondance cheese region.

Every aspect of cheese-making will be on show, from cows to goats, to farmers and cheesemakers, all present over this immersive weekend showcasing their skills and products in the exceptional surroundings of Pre la Joux.

As well as these interesting encounters, suitable for all ages, there will be a hike to the sound of cow bells (an "emmontagnée" - cows heading to summer pastures), cheese making demonstrations and a wide choice of AOP and IGP cheese-based activities to tickle the tastebuds. Visitors will learn about the rich regional and local heritage

thanks to the local associations and artisans who will be at the event.

Registered on the Gold Trophy list of the French Cycling Federation, the cyclosportive "Châtel Chablais Léman







Race" this year celebrates its 6th edition. Over 2 days participants will compete in the following races which, as always, traverse the beautiful countryside on tracks between France and Switzerland.

Sailing courses at Vonnes Lake with the Voile 74 sailing school (who also offer courses for beginners and experienced, children and adults from sailing to SUP) ... in the mountains!!

Sunday 28th to Wednesday 31st July RETURN TO CHILDHOOD FESTIVAL - CHÂTEL

A week dedicated to children, with activities and entertainment for children of all ages, creating unforgettable memories. The "Festival Pass", gives access to many of these activities.

Sunday 4th August FÊTE DE LA SAINT LAURENT

Mass at St Laurent church followed by a procession, early evening concert with aperitif, float parade and open-air party with dancing.

Châtel residents join with holiday visitors in this vibrant homage to the patron saint of the parish.

Sunday 18th August LA BELLE DIMANCHE, Cowherd's festival in the Plaine Dranse pastures.

This $46^{\rm th}$ edition of La Belle Dimanche agricultural show in the Plaine Dranse meadows, dates from when the priest would come to bless the cattle. There will be an outdoor Mass, animal show, prize-giving, craft fair, cheese making, s'nailles fair, folk groups, traditional games and of course delicious food and drink. A fun-filled day for one of the most popular traditional fairs in the region! The full and varied programme of this fete, featuring traditional mountain customs, is always popular with the numerous visitors who come to enjoy this special day. Herders, cattle and the public come together to enjoy a special event, in beautiful surroundings.

BIKE PARK

The Châtel Bike Park, at Pré la Joux, accessed by the Pierre Longue or Rochassons chair lifts, will burst into life from June, once again providing thrills and excitement for downhill mountain bikers. With 20 downhill tracks of all levels and varied activity areas; kid's shore, two slopestyles, one pro and one pump-track, the discipline is well-served in this area hugely popular with downhill Mountain bikers.

The Bike Park is maintained by a team of 10 bike patrollers, who open and close the area, ensure security, maintain the park, provide first aid and give help and advice when required.

NEW:

- "Flash" red run, between the Serpentine and the People: a narrow, fairly wild section through the forest from which you can get back to the People from the Serpentine and connect to the trails below.
- "Eterlou" red run, wide, with a moderate slope, steep jumps and turns.
- **Two slope styles:** the first, accessible to the general public with a good knowledge of jumping, and the second, more professional, completely reshaped by the Bike Park team during the summer of 2022, accessible to experienced riders with advanced dirt/freeride ability.
- Following the addition of bonerlag to the step up step down at the end of the track, the start of **the Zougouloukata has now been reshaped**.

OPENING DATES:

- From 9th to 18th June: Fridays Saturdays and Sundays
- From 23rd June to 3rd September: Every day (night opening on Friday from 14th July and 25th August).

From 9th to 17th September: Saturdays and Sundays.

This activity involves riding BMX bikes with wide tyres on the mountain laser biathlon tracks.

Equipped in this way, the BMX is fun and accessible to everyone, it is also a helpful stepping stone to enduro and downhill riding. Achieving the combined goal of riding and shooting, requires mastery of balance, breathing, concentration, and biking. The laser gun, used for the shooting section, is completely safe.

There are different free-wheeling routes:

The green course with two options; either following a path beside the rolling carpet, or a longer option dotted with fun modules through the trees. The final climb must be completed with momentum only ... no pedalling!

The blue course is more technical, going into the woods, along the Dranse river between stumps, rocks and wooden modules. The goal here, is to test your dexterity, by negotiating these obstacles.

The rules require an initial descent before shooting. Controlled breathing and concentration are required to hit the 5 targets. Once done, descend the track of your choice to the top of the rolling carpet. The first back wins the game. If a shot is missed a penalty lap on the flat loop is required.

ELECTRIC MTB

There are 6 marked E-MTB circuits in Châtel. E-MTB allow visitors to explore the wider countryside and make the most of the beautiful scenery and sites along the roads and tracks.

- Col du Saix: easy: 10 km, positive height difference 623 m
- La Mouille loop: easy: 8 km, positive height difference 639 m.
- Châtel-Morgins circuit: intermediate: 17 km, positive height difference 600 m
- Tour du Morclan: difficult: 17 km, positive height difference 650 m
- Tour du Mont de Grange: difficult: 37 km, positive height difference 1,290 m
- Vonnes-Col de Bassachaux-Sur Bayard loop: very difficult:

28 km, positive height difference 1,130 m

Battery charging points are located in the resort and in the Portes du Soleil along circuits and in the villages.

Cycle touring is an important element of the "two-wheel" offer in Châtel. Cyclists are never disappointed by the numerous, varied, trans-frontal routes.

Châtel was a stage on the 2022 Tour de France, was accredited "Ville Etape Tour de France - 3 Bikes" in 2021 and before that, a "Welcome Bike" destination. The 6th edition of the Châtel Chablais Léman Race takes place on the 20th and 21st July (full details in Summer Events 2024). The race is in both France and Switzerland and will now be included in the All-Discipline Cycling World Championships which will be held in Haute-Savoie in 2027.

SOME LOCAL SPOTS...

The Col de Bassachaux (French) is located at an altitude of 1778m, 12kms from the village centre with a 5.5% slope over the final kilometres!

Cyclists end their ride with a 6 km uphill push from Pré la Joux. From the edge of Châtel, it's 10.4 km, a difference in altitude of 665 meters and an average slope of 6.5%, a real challenge that athletes take on every summer. Once at the top, the return is on the same route.

The Pas de Morgins (Swiss) is located at an altitude of 1374m. It is the crossing point connecting the Abondance valley via Thonon-les-Bains, and the Illiez valley via the Morgins valley towards Monthey. From La Chapelle d'Abondance, its average gradient is 5.2% over 6.4 km. It has been crossed several times during cycle races such as the Tour de France, the Critérium du Dauphiné, the Tour de Romandie, the Tour du Val d'Aoste...

The Col du Corbier (French) is located at an altitude of 1237m. It links the Abondance Valley to the Valley d'Aulps (via Le Biot). From the village of Bonnevaux, at the start of the climb, the average gradient is 7.1% over 5.7kms. This has also been crossed several times by the Tour de France, the Critérium du Dauphiné...

PORTES DU SOLEIL **MULTI PASS**

THE summer passport for only €3.00 per day, per person for the duration of their stay - available for visitors staying with participating accommodation providers. The Portes du Soleil Multi Pass gives unlimited access to 25 pedestrian chair lifts and 800 kms of walking trails, to swimming pools and lakes, to tennis courts, squash, padel, little tourist trains, mini-golfs, cultural sites... in addition activities offering reductions on presentation of the pass across the Portes du Soleil territory and its 12 Franco-Swiss resorts.

IN CHÂTEL, the 4 ski lifts open in summer, the Forme d'O aquatic centre, tennis courts, the little tourist train, the Chamois cinema, the Loy mini-golf, C-l'Aventure and the elastic trampoline session are also included. The Old Customs House (revealing the history of mountain contraband in the area), the Fantasticable (with twin flight lines where visitors are comfortably strapped in to a harness and fly at 240 m high over the valley between 80-100 km/h), the bobluge piste (with 7 bends), cinemas, Châtel Aventures (and its tree top circuits), Spa Océane, Châtel Fun Bike (for all levels) give reductions with the pass.





AND...

Among the many activities on offer, each week, throughout the season, is a new addition to the family programme:

"EMILE'S TREASURE - TREASURE HUNT"

in the village streets. Follow in Emile's footsteps, a former smuggler without descendants, who is looking for his heir to bequeath him his fabulous "treasure". But Emile, being a player, wants his heir to be worthy of this bequest.

Leave Emile's office with a bag, and follow his directions, walking the streets of Châtel, solving the riddles he has left, opening padlocks, observing carefully and, if you succeed, you'll discover his precious "treasure". 1 hour 30 to 2 hours 30 is needed to complete the treasure hunt.

THE QUEST FOR DELICIOUS DELIGHTS


This innovative treasure hunt, suitable for all ages, is a fun way for visitors to discover local agriculture and produce and meet a farmer.

"FLOCON VERT", "PAYS D'ART ET D'HISTOIRE", "GEOPARC" LABELS

Agriculture, landscapes, traditions, heritage, hiking, know-how, gastronomy, new cultural and tourist space...



FLOCON VERT

Flocon Vert is an accreditation which guarantees the sustainability credentials of mountain tourist destinations. The Mountain Riders association developed this idea to support territories in their sustainability transition and give mountain lovers a clear indication of committed tourist destinations. It is good practice to choose an accredited resort and be sure of supporting responsible tourism.

Châtel has been Flocon Vert accredited since 2015 and since the last renewal on December 7, 2020, is labelled Flocon Vert - 2 flakes. The work required to maintain this level, or even move to the next, is gradual. It requires the implication of all local services and businesses

Given its agro-pastural history and landscape, Châtel naturally fulfills many of the criteria required.

VILLE ET PAYS D'ART ET D'HISTOIRE

This label recognises territories which, aware of the challenges presented by the appropriation of their architecture and heritage by their inhabitants, engage actively to educate, conserve, mediate and support architectural quality and the quality of the environment.

The Abondance Valley was accredited in 2003 and the extension of this accreditation to all municipalities in the Evian Valley d'Abondance was validated in August 2019.

GEOPARK

A UNESCO Global Geopark is a unified geographical area, with sites and landscapes of geological interest of international importance. They are managed globally ensuring protection, education, and sustainable development. The Chablais UNESCO Global Geopark is in Haute-Savoie, between Lake Geneva and Mont-Blanc. It extends over 62 municipalities and covers nearly 900 km² with over 150,000 inhabitants. A dedicated guide to the Chablais Géoparc has just been published making the information more accessible.

The Chablais obtained the Global Geopark label in 2012. It extends from the southern shores of Lake Geneva to the summits of the Portes du Soleil. In Châtel, the Col de Bassachaux is a Géosite as is the Lac des Plagnes in Abondance. The partner visitor sites are: La Vieille Douane in Châtel, the Maison du Fromage and the Abbaye d'Abondance.

The quality of the local natural and cultural heritage makes the Geopark an essential destination for visitors wishing to understand the true essence of the Chablais region.





AGRICULTURE

Châtel has 30 working farms. Between 10 and 15 of them make Abondance (AOP) cheese every day, in the village in winter and in the mountains in summer. These farms are passed from generation to generation, preserving both the farms and the traditional way of life. The average age of today's farmers is between 35 and 40 yrs old.

TRADITIONS

In some areas life has continued, largely unchanged for generations. The 'emmontagnée' at the end of May/beginning of June is an example. Farmers take their Abondance cattle and leave the village for the high pastures where they spend the summer, often moving from pasture to pasture ensuring the cattle always have the best quality grass. Then, with the arrival of the first snows, they return to their village farms for the winter.

KNOW-HOW

Abondance cheese - AOP since 1990 is made every day. Weighing between 6kg and 12kg, the cheeses have concave sides and are between 7cm and 8cm high. One wheel of this semi-cooked, pressed cheese requires around 100 litres of full fat, unpasteurised milk. Each wheel is then matured for 100 days in cellars at a temperature of between 11° and 12° before the amber-rinded cheese with its signature soft, melty consistency is ready to eat.

GASTRONOMY

Abondance cheese is the principal ingredient in the famous local dish Berthoud, which has had the « Spécialité Traditionnelle Garantie » label since September 2020. This local speciality holds pride of place in Châtel and the Abondance valley and its preparation follows strict guidelines. Many alpine farms and restaurants along the hiking trails welcome guests offering ample opportunity to try this local delicacy in its traditional surroundings.

HERITAGE

The old village buildings reveal much about the Châtel and Abondance Valley identity. These traditional farms, with two low-pitched roof sections and carved balconies, have endured for generations. Some are over 100 years old. Beside them, the small barns (greniers) were traditionally used to protect valuables in case of fire in the main house.

Originally scattered over the landscape, these chalets are the inspiration for the many modern 2 to 4 story wood and stone built chalets and homes now built amongst them. In this way the traditional architectural style of the area has been sympathetically preserved.

LANDSCAPE

Located at mid-mountain height, Châtel (1,200m altitude) is the last village along the Abondance Valley. It is well located on a sunny, south facing slope in the northern part of the Northern Alps, on the border of Valais, Switzerland. The River Dranse, with its source in one of the outlaying hamlets, Plaine Dranse, flows through the village.

The 16km path along the river is regularly maintained in spring providing an agreeable environment for walkers and mountain bikers. Once completed this path will link Châtel and Chevenoz.

The Châtel landscape comprises a significant number of forests and semi natural areas, 89.6% (in 2018).

In this landscape, created in 1974 on natural wetland, fed by the Vonnes stream flowing from Pas de Morgins in Switzerland, Lake Vonnes sits in a beautiful natural environment. For its 50th birthday, the Lake is undergoing a major makeover to enhance the site's natural surroundings and assure the future of its lively, welcoming appeal with a new dynamic for visitors.

A stroll along the shores of the lake is the perfect environment for contemplation. A raised wooden path allows visitors to see into the lake (a seating area is planned). New programmable, environmentally friendly lighting has been installed. The connection to Vonnes stream has been rewilded. A playground over 400 m2 with a zip line, slide, balance course for little ones, has replaced the old ice rink. The lighting of the site has been completely redesigned to meet the challenges of protecting nocturnal biodiversity.





HIKING

Hiking is the primary summer activity. Numerous visitors wait impatiently until the snow melts to put on their walking boots and conquer the great outdoors!

Hiking ideas on the 90km of footpaths in Châtel

- Super Châtel Lakes (fairly easy) / Châtel
- Boudîmes chalets (easy) / Châtel
- Tour de Don (difficult) / Châtel and Torgon (Switzerland)

Hiking is also the perfect way to discover the mid-mountain heritage. See pastures and forests, farms, chalets, chapels, oratories and crosses. There are fascinating fauna and flora, the UNESCO Chablais Geopark at the col de Bassachaux (1,778m altitude) and the Natura 2000 nature reserve at Mont de Grange (2,432m altitude). Visitors can explore the reserve unaccompanied or join a guided visit to learn more about the natural riches of this protected area.

With or without a Multi Pass, some may prefer walking the trails in a family group.

THE OLD CUSTOMS HOUSE, MOUNTAIN CONTRABAND VISITOR CENTRE

The Old Customs house is an interesting museum and information centre chronicling this important aspect of local history. Smuggling was rife throughout Châtel, the Abondance Valley and the Portes du Soleil due to their proximity to the Swiss border.

Visitors can enjoy the museum independently or with commentary and there are fun activities and games for all ages, immersing participants in the world of the principal smuggling protagonists: The smugglers and the customs men.

Amongst them "The Old Customs House is Recruiting!" with an original approach. The current Customs Man is retiring, and a replacement is required.

Participants agree to accept the challenge of trying various job-specific activities.

Or try the "Secret operations of La Vieille Douane" challenge in which participants put themselves in the shoes of a customs officer or smuggler and test their reactions in different situations.

NEW CULTURAL AND TOURISM AREA

Currently under construction, this new facility will be completed in 2025. Located in the village centre, it will house the tourist office and a room for events, seminars and ceremonies.

Like the Forme d'O aquatic centre inaugurated in July 2014, the design of which is based on "High Environmental Quality" criteria, the cultural and tourism facility has also taken environmental considerations into account using local wood labelled "Bois des Alpes" and low-carbon concrete in its construction. A biomass boiler will also be installed.
